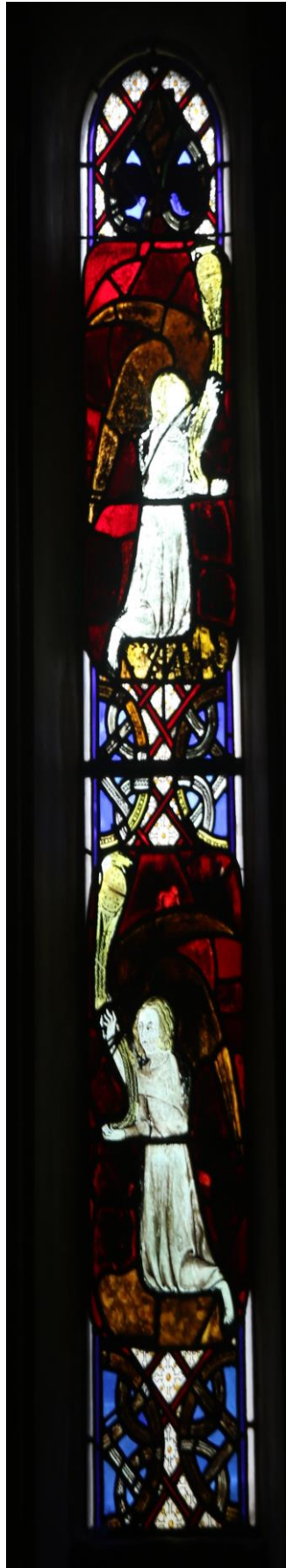


North Aisle Apse (NADFS 717)
